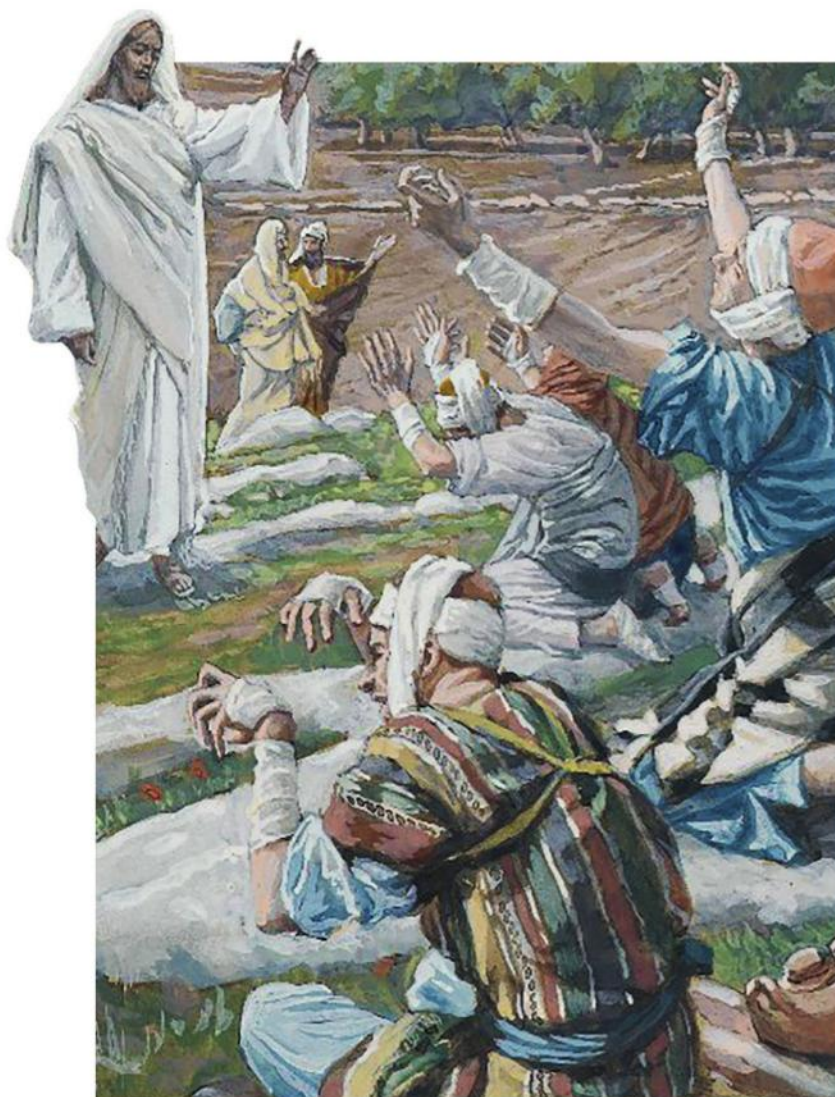

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centered on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption.

The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They focus on the events from Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane to His crucifixion and death on Calvary.

These five mysteries are:

1. The Agony of Jesus in the Garden.
2. The Scourging of Jesus at the Pillar.
3. The Crowning with Thorns.
4. Jesus Carries the Cross.
5. The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus.

The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died. His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for His Mother.

These five mysteries are:

1. The Resurrection of Jesus
2. Jesus Ascension into Heaven
3. Descent of the Holy Spirit
4. The Assumption of Mary
5. The Coronation of Mary



St. Joseph's Corner

If we persevere, we shall also reign with Him.
—2 Tim 2:12

This is a line that not only distills a core tenet of St. Paul's theology—it can, if we let it, evoke a heroic drive, inspiring the very fierce opposition Paul, or rather Saul, exhibited before his encounter with Jesus in the desert. Before grace broke through, Saul's energy was outward, directed at conquering error and defending purity through force. But after meeting Christ, Paul's perseverance became something else entirely: not a fight against others, but a faithful abiding within the love that had conquered him.

The word “persevere” in this passage is translated from the Greek word *hypomenō*. It literally means “to remain under.” It does not call us to rebellion or resistance, it calls us to endurance—to stay beneath the weight of life and mystery without fleeing. Perseverance is not the work of heroes who overcome the world; it is the discipline of saints who remain under the cross until resurrection dawns.

Hence the importance of patience in the New Testament, which becomes the basic constituent of Christianity, more central even than humility: the power to wait, to persevere, to hold out, to endure to the end, not to transcend one's own limitations, not to force issues by playing the hero or the titan, but to practice that which lies beyond heroism, the meekness of the lamb which is led.

—Hans Urs von Balthasar, *A Theology of History*
(English trans.)

This is the perseverance of St. Joseph. He did not battle oppressors and rally followers. Instead, he stayed—under the weight of confusion, exile, poverty, and silence—trusting that God was present even in his own uncertainty. His strength was not in resisting but in receptivity. He didn't seek to exert control over the world outside of him, but instead he chose to remain where grace was at work within.

Remaining Until It Redeems

If we read this reflection through the lens of the modern world, we may be tempted to see perseverance as resignation or passivity. But it is neither, for the fruit it bears is transformation. We remain under—not to be crushed, but to be conformed. Just as coal, under pressure and with patience, becomes a diamond, so too will grace lift us up to share glory with Christ if we remain in Him.

To remain under is not to surrender to defeat; it is to allow God's hand to press His image more deeply into the soul. Perseverance refines us—it exposes the false strength of self-reliance and replaces it with the quiet strength of trust. It is the space where our pride is dissolved and our dependence on God becomes complete.

The outcome of the battle of good versus evil has already

been decided. Christ is the victor, and His victory is absolute. Yet the echoes of that battle continue in our time, and they reach into every human heart. God does not ask us to fight the cosmic war anew. The struggle He entrusts to us is interior: the battle within the soul—to remain in grace, to persevere under the weight of the world, and to resist the temptation of despair. Our sword is surrender, and our shield is hope.

In this sense, perseverance is not about conquering evil out there, but about refusing to let it take root in here. It is the daily decision to keep our hearts aligned with the One who has already conquered. When we remain steadfast in Him, we participate in His victory—not by might, but by fidelity.

This is the perseverance of St. Joseph. He fought no visible wars, yet he endured every trial of faith. In remaining under those burdens with trust, he became the guardian of the Redeemer and the quiet instrument of God's plan. Through his fidelity, the divine plan unfolded in silence.

So too in us: when we remain faithful beneath the weight of life—when we persevere in prayer, patience, and hope—God brings forth the same hidden glory. What seems small and unseen in this life becomes radiant in the light of eternity.

Perseverance in the Home

Perseverance begins where love is tested most—at home. For husbands and fathers, the weight we remain under is often the ordinary cross of responsibility: the long hours, the unseen sacrifices, the quiet moments when we wonder if our efforts truly matter. Yet it is precisely there, in the hidden routines of family life, that grace is at work.

To persevere as a husband is to love when it feels unnoticed, to listen when you'd rather withdraw, to remain present when fatigue tempts you to escape. To persevere as a father is to keep showing up—to pray with your family, to lead by example, to model faithfulness when the world values comfort over commitment.

Perseverance for us does not mean control; it means constancy. It is choosing, every day, to stay under the weight of love—to remain beneath the vocation God has entrusted to us—trusting that He is shaping us through it.

When we stay—when we keep loving in the small and unseen ways—we echo the perseverance of St. Joseph. Through such fidelity, the divine plan still unfolds in silence: in the hearts of our wives, our children, and our homes.

Dear brothers, stay where God has placed you, and love the people He has given you.

You don't need to do more; you need only to remain faithful. When you feel the pressure, don't flee. Remain under. Grace is at work there.

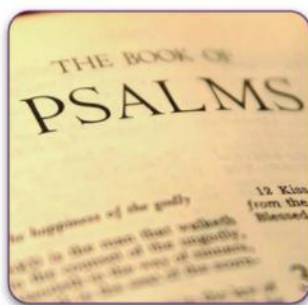

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking your venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home to make the arrangements. The funeral home will then contact the Faith Formation Office at Our Mother of Good Counsel (OMGC) to notify us about the upcoming funeral Mass. We (OMGC) will get in touch with the family and work together to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



Religious Education: We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
