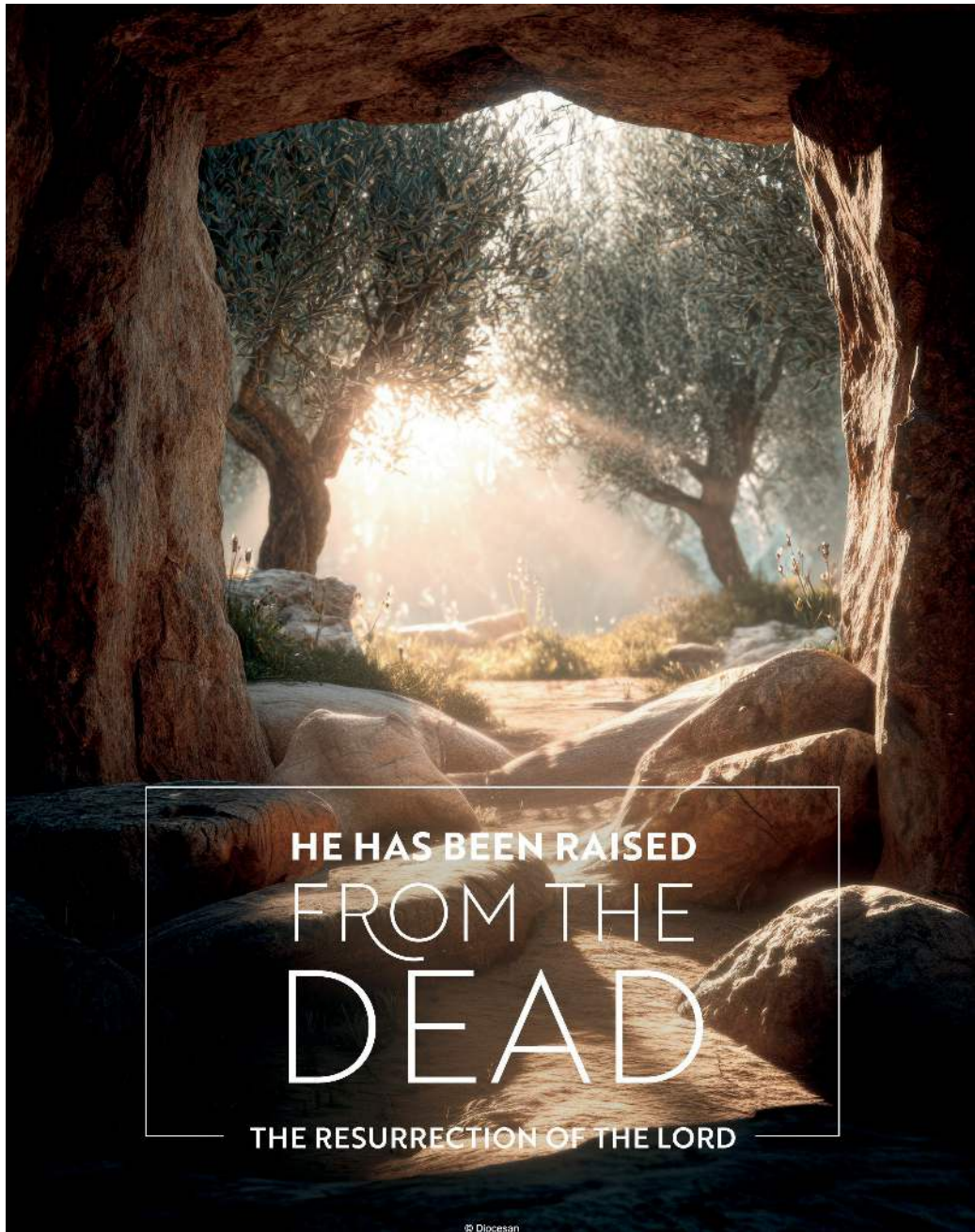

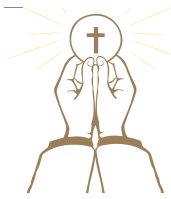

**Chrism Mass-** Last Monday, the Diocese of Joliet celebrated the Chrism Mass, a beautiful liturgy where priests from every church in the Diocese gathered to witness Bishop Spies blessing the holy oils. It is a powerful tradition to have over 160 priests gathered together to pray over the three Sacred Oils that will anoint and bless many throughout the year: the Oil of the Sick, which brings spiritual strength to the ill and the elderly; the Oil of Catechumens, which protects and prepares adults and infants awaiting Baptism; and the Sacred Chrism, which is used to anoint the newly baptized, those receiving the sacrament of Confirmation, and men being ordained to the priesthood. During the Chrism consecration, Bishop Spies added the balsam that represents the 'aroma of holiness' and breathed into the oil three times to call down the Holy Spirit. It is truly a beautiful moment of unity and grace.



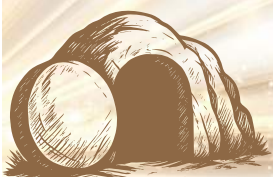

## A WORD FROM FR. GREG

### Christ is Risen!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May the triumphant joy of our Risen Lord fill your hearts, your homes, and your families today!

A famous phrase made popular by St. John Paul II is: "We are Easter people, and Alleluia is our song." This means we are called to focus on the light of the Resurrection rather than on worldly darkness. It is the Resurrection that defines us as Catholics, and knowing Jesus is ultimately victorious, we can face the hardships or "Good Fridays" of our lives. Answer this call to bring this hopeful light into the world.

For some in our parish family, the joy of Easter Sunday begins before the sun comes up. Our 5:30 AM Mass features a traditional dawn procession. This tradition puts us in the footsteps of Mary Magdalene and the faithful women who set out for the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark. During the procession, bells ring out as the Blessed Sacrament is carried triumphantly. We are announcing to the waking world that the tomb is empty and death has been defeated. As the first rays of sunlight emerge, we are reminded that Christ's light shatters the dark.

The celebration of Easter does not end on Sunday. Easter Sunday through Divine Mercy Sunday is known as the Easter Octave. These days of the octave are to be celebrated with the same joy as Easter Sunday.

The worldwide Catholic Church calls the day after Easter "Monday of the Angel". This is in reference to the Gospel of Saint Matthew, where the angel tells the women that Jesus is not here but has been raised!

The Resurrection is not a single event, but an ongoing, living reality that requires more than one day of thanksgiving.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who makes it possible for our parish to thrive. Beyond the liturgy, we sincerely appreciate the many volunteers who work behind the scenes to ensure your experience in the church is a celebration and a time to be in His presence, from decorating (tomb, prison, church) to the collection counters. All these teams volunteered for extra hours during this time. To all the volunteers you see during your worship—the liturgical volunteers (Sacristans, Lectors, EMs, Servers, Ushers, Priests, and Deacons)—and the musicians. Spreading the Gospel would be impossible without all of you.

May the light of Christ's Resurrection dispel all darkness and renew hope for our parish community. Truly, He is Risen!

## Chrystus Zmartwychwstał!

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Niech triumfalna radość naszego Zmartwychwstałego Pana napelni dziś wasze serca, wasze domy i wasze rodziny!

Znane powiedzenie spopularyzowane przez św. Jana Pawła II brzmi: „Jesteśmy ludem wielkanocnym, a Alleluja jest naszą pieśnią.” Oznacza to, że jesteśmy wezwani, aby skupiać się na świetle Zmartwychwstania, a nie na ciemności tego świata. To właśnie Zmartwychwstanie nas definiuje jako katolików. Wiedząc, że Jezus ostatecznie zwyciężył, możemy stawić czoła trudnościom, czyli „Wielkim Piątkom” naszego życia. Odpowiedzmy na to wezwanie, niosąc to pełne nadziei światło światu.

Dla niektórych w naszej parafialnej rodzinie radość Niedzieli Wielkanocnej zaczyna się jeszcze przed wschodem słońca. Msza Święta o godz. 5:30 obejmuje tradycyjną procesję o świcie. Ta tradycja pozwala nam iść śladami Marii Magdaleny i wiernych kobiet, które wyruszyły do grobu wcześniej rano, gdy było jeszcze ciemno. Podczas procesji rozbrzmiewają dzwony, a Najświętszy Sakrament jest niesiony w triumfie. Ogłaszamy budzącemu się światu, że grób jest pusty, a śmierć została pokonana. Gdy pojawiają się pierwsze promienie słońca, przypominają nam, że światło Chrystusa rozprasza ciemność.

Świętowanie Wielkanocy nie kończy się w niedzielę. Okres od Niedzieli Wielkanocnej do Niedzieli Miłosierdzia Bożego nazywany jest Oktawą Wielkanocy. Dni tej oktawy należy przeżywać z taką samą radością jak samą Niedzielę Wielkanocną.

Kościół katolicki na całym świecie nazywa dzień po Wielkanocy „Poniedziałkiem Anielskim”. Nawiązuje to do Ewangelii według św. Mateusza, gdzie anioł mówi kobietom, że Jezusa tu nie ma, ponieważ zmartwychwstał.

Zmartwychwstanie nie jest jednorazowym wydarzeniem, lecz trwającą, żywą rzeczywistością, która wymaga więcej niż jednego dnia dziękczynienia.

Pragnę również skorzystać z tej okazji, aby podziękować wszystkim, którzy sprawiają, że nasza parafia może się rozwijać. Oprócz liturgii doceniamy wielu wolontariuszy, którzy pracują za kulisami, aby wasze uczestnictwo w kościele było prawdziwym przeżyciem i czasem spotkania z Bogiem – od przygotowania dekoracji (grób, więzienie, kościół) po liczenie składek. Wszystkie te grupy poświęciły dodatkowe godziny swojej pracy w tym szczególnym czasie.

Dziękujemy wszystkim posługującym podczas liturgii – zakrystianom, lektorom, nadzwyczajnym szafarzom Komunii Świętej, ministrantom, porządkowym, kapłanom i diakonom – oraz muzykom. Bez was głoszenie Ewangelii byłoby niemożliwe.

Niech światło Zmartwychwstania Chrystusa rozprasza wszelką ciemność i odnawia nadzieję w naszej wspólnotce parafialnej.

## Easter Sunday Message from Bishop Dennis E. Spies April 2026



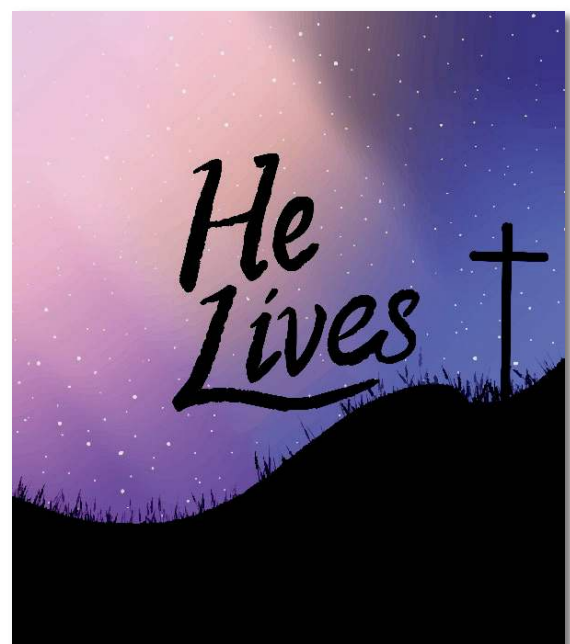
Happy Easter everyone! This is the greatest of all the celebrations. Everything we celebrate all year culminates Easter Sunday. Have you ever considered that the whole point of Christmas is that Easter Sunday needs to happen?

Sometimes we forget in our life that Easter Sunday is real. We think a lot about the passion that Jesus had to go through on Good Friday and how we participate in it. When life is difficult and we're struggling, we sometimes forget about Easter Sunday during the year. It's important for us to remember that any time we're going through something and we're struggling, and then somehow we get through it, and it's extraordinary afterwards—that's Easter Sunday in your life.

Our Lord Jesus participated in Easter Sunday to let us know that he has power over life and death. His life wasn't taken from him. He gave it away—the same with rising from the dead. He chose to rise from the dead. Why would he do that? To let us know that we're next. We get to participate in this resurrection when we follow Him throughout our whole life. And the whole point of the resurrection is the proclamation of eternal life, that we will rise from the dead when we die. Thanks be to God that He saw fit to give us such an example.

This witness is apparent as we enter into this Easter season when we see the apostles boldly testifying to the resurrection from the dead—most of them with their lives. They were martyred on account of their testimony, so it's not just an expression. Jesus actually rose from the dead, and they gave their lives to testify to it.

So, this year, remember that celebrating Easter is about celebrating Jesus' rising from the dead, and the hope that he gives us. Rather than filling up on chocolate Easter bunnies and eggs because you gave up chocolate for Lent, celebrate the resurrection of the Lord Jesus in your life, rising out of the many challenges you face to give you hope in this life and in the life to come. Thanks be to God.

**He Is Risen, He Is Risen Indeed!!**

## SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION



**Baptism:** Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking a venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



**Marriage:** The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



**Funerals:** The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home to make the arrangements. The funeral home will then contact the Faith Formation Office at Our Mother of Good Counsel (OMGC) to notify us about the upcoming funeral Mass. We (OMGC) will get in touch with the family and work together to organize the funeral liturgy.



**Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized:** If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



**Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits:** Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.



**Religious Education:** We offer religious education classes for grades 1-8. Call the Faith Formation Office for more information. Classes meet Wednesday, 6:00-7:30PM September through March.
